

STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW, CAMPUS AWARENESS AND CAMPUS SECURITY ACT

Under the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, Otero Junior College is required to make the following information available to current and prospective students:

OJC Campus Security is responsible for monitoring and recording criminal activities occurring on college property. In addition to traditional law enforcement responsibilities, Campus Security enforces parking regulations, maintains building security, conducts fire safety inspections, and makes frequent security checks at the residence hall. Safety and security information is provided to students and college staff through bulletins, crime alerts, posters, and brochures. All crimes occurring on campus are reported in both the college and La Junta newspapers.

Campus Security does not have police jurisdiction over public or private property. Department staff work in close cooperation with the La Junta Police Department, Otero County Sheriff's Department, and other Federal, State and local agencies. Arrests and apprehensions are referred to the La Junta Police Department; community fire and ambulance personnel are notified as necessary. All criminal incidents occurring on campus must be reported to Campus Security as soon as possible.

Colorado law prohibits the possession, consumption, or distribution of alcohol and controlled substances on campus.
