## SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION


### GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Otero Junior College, in cooperation with Colorado State University-Fort Collins, has developed a two-year Associate of Science Degree with an emphasis in Soil and Crop Science. Upon successful completion, the degree as well as all classes associated with the degree will transfer seamlessly to CSU-Fort Collins. Students will have the opportunity to earn a bachelor's degree in the Soil and Crop Science Program with an additional 60 hours of credit.
2. 10 scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$1,000 each year for the two-year program.
3. Recipients must be a citizen of the United States, a resident of Colorado for tuition purposes, and a graduate from an accredited high school with a 2.8 grade point average or higher.
4. The recipients will be selected by the Otero Junior College Scholarship Committee on the basis outlined above, letters of recommendation as well as the abilities of the candidate.
